About Penn Global Seminars:

Penn Global Seminars combine intensive semester-long study with a short-term travel component that is intended to deepen students' understanding of concepts discussed in the classroom. These courses require the same number of contact hours per week as a typical undergraduate seminar, and the travel component takes place for 8 – 12 days during a break period, such as winter break, spring break, or early-mid May. Undergraduates from all disciplines are encouraged to take a Penn Global Seminar during their time at Penn, and these courses are particularly advantageous to freshmen and sophomores, first-generation, low-income students, and students who, for a variety of reasons, are not able to study abroad for a semester or academic year, such as athletes and students with particularly rigorous curricular requirements.

The Penn Global Seminar program represents a partnership between Penn Global and Penn's academic departments; this program could not exist without the support and interest of Penn's faculty, department chairs, deans, and administrative staff. Penn Global Seminars are financially supported by contributions from the Ahmad Fund and the Provost's Global Engagement Fund, and are administered by Penn Abroad.

The Penn Global Seminar program can provide students in your department and School with additional opportunities to study abroad in a structured and dynamic way, and allow them to foster closer relationships with your faculty. The program also provides an avenue for students across Penn to experience what your discipline has to offer, and even consider a major or minor through your department.

Financial concerns and faculty compensation:

Students who participate in a Penn Global Seminar will pay a \$950 flat program fee, which is a contribution toward their round-trip airfare, ground transportation, accommodations, group meals, excursions, entry fees, translators, and guides. Penn Global will subsidize these costs through financial contributions from the Ahmad Fund and the Provost's Global Engagement Fund. In addition, Penn Global will pay for all faculty expenses related to running the course. A Penn Global staff member will accompany the course to provide logistical and student support in the field. The department's only financial commitment related to the Penn Global Seminar is to compensate the instructor for teaching the course.
